Family Research Council presents our vote scorecard for the 107th Congress. This scorecard contains a compilation of significant votes representing a cross-section of issues affecting the family that occurred in the U.S. House of Representatives during the Second Session of the 107th Congress in 2002, and votes that occurred in the U.S. Senate during the entire 107th Congress (2001 and 2002).

This scorecard serves as an important tool in showing you how your elected officials voted on some of the most important issues facing the family. It is important to remember, however, that the votes you see here are only a few of the hundreds of recorded votes which members of the House of Representatives took in 2002 and members of the Senate took during the two year period spanning 2001 and 2002. With this in mind, we have tried to single out for inclusion the most clear-cut, pro-family and anti-family votes that came before Members of Congress.

This scorecard marks the end of the 107th Congress but it does not mark the end of our work on the issues explained inside. Our efforts to defend and protect faith, family and freedom continue. While we maintain a constant watch of what is taking place in our nation's capitol, we rely upon you, informed and active constituents, to work with us in contacting your members of Congress on pro-family issues. 1 Promoting School Choice

Offered by Senator Judd Gregg (R-NH), this amendment (S.AMDT.536 to S. 1) would provide for a low-income school choice demonstration program. This program would fund studies concerning the relative success of private schools and public charter schools versus public schools in low-income areas.

Failed 6/12/2001 FRC Supported this Amendment

2 Encouraging Intellectual Freedom and Scientific Debate

Offered by Senator Rick Santorum (R-PA), this amendment (S.AMDT.799 to S. 1) would seek to better inform our nation's students regarding science education. Specifically, this amendment states that while students are taught about biological evolution, they should also be provided with information explaining different perspectives and why this subject generates continuing controversy.

Passed 6/13/2001 FRC Supported this Amendment

3 Protecting the Boy Scouts of America

Offered by Senator Jesse Helms (R-NC), this amendment (S.AMDT.648 to S. 1) would prohibit the distribution of federal funds to any state or local educational agency or school that discriminates against the Boy Scouts of America in providing equal access to school premises or facilities. This amendment prevents discrimination against the Boy Scouts of America for their policy regarding the employment or voluntary service of homosexual troop leaders.

Passed 6/14/01 FRC Supported this Amendment

4 Protecting Freedom of Speech

The Campaign Finance Reform Act (H.R. 2356) would limit the freedom of speech of Americans with regard to political campaigns. The bill would ban all contributions of "soft money," and impose severe restrictions on issue advocacy communications. The bill was signed into law March 27, 2002 (P.L. 107-155).

Passed 3/20/2002 FRC Opposed this Bill

5 Supporting a Fair and Impartial Judiciary

Offered by Senator Trent Lott (R-MS), this amendment (S.AMDT.3033 to S. 517) would provide for the fair treatment of presidential judicial nominees by pressing the Senate Judiciary Committee to hold hearings for nominees to positions on Circuit, Appeals, and District Courts that are unable to process their caseloads due to judicial vacancies.

Failed 3/21/2002 FRC Supported this Amendment

6 Preventing the Establishment of Thought Crimes

FRC opposed a vote to send this bill to the floor for final passage. Introduced by Senator Edward Kennedy (D-MA), the Local Law Enforcement Enhancement Act (S. 625) or "hate crimes" bill would expand the jurisdiction of the federal government by giving it the power to interpret and classify certain speech, thought, theology, and moral belief as unlawful or contributing to crime. This bill would have a chilling effect on free speech.

Failed 6/11/2002 FRC Opposed this Motion

7 Permanent Repeal of the Death Tax

Offered by Senator Phil Gramm (R-TX), this amendment (S.AMDT.3833 to H.R. 8) would make permanent the repeal of the death tax contained in the 2001 Tax Relief Package.

Failed 6/12/2002 FRC Supported this Amendment

8 Prohibiting the Patenting of Human Clones

A vote to cut off debate effectively killed the amendment offered by Senator Sam Brownback (R-KS). This amendment (S.AMDT.3843 to S. 2600) would bar researchers from obtaining a patent on any form of human life produced through cloning.

Passed 6/18/2002 FRC Opposed this Motion

9 Preventing Abortions in Military Hospitals

Offered by Senators Olympia Snowe (R-ME) and Patty Murray (D-WA), this amendment (S.AMDT.3927 to S. 2514) would repeal current law prohibiting domestic and overseas U.S. military hospitals and medical clinics from performing privately-funded abortions for U.S. service members and their families.

Passed 6/21/2002 FRC Opposed this Amendment
