Dear Voter and Friend of the Family,

FRC Action presents our Vote Scorecard for 2019, the First Session of the 116th Congress. This scorecard contains a compilation of significant votes on federal legislation affecting our faith, our families, and our freedom that FRC Action either supported or opposed. These recorded votes span the 2019 calendar year.

In the U.S. Senate, FRC Action scored in favor of two key pro-life bills. First, the *No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act*, which would permanently codify the Hyde Amendment, thereby prohibiting federal funds from paying for elective abortion and health care plans that include elective abortion coverage. FRC Action also scored in favor of the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act*, which would require health care practitioners to provide life-saving medical care to babies born alive after an attempted abortion. Unfortunately, both bills failed to pass but did serve to put Senators on record regarding abortion funding and infanticide. As the result of intense organized opposition, FRC Action also scored in favor of the nomination of Sarah Pitlyk to be U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Missouri. Pitlyk is a solid pro-life originalist and had previously litigated important religious freedom and abortion-related cases such as *Burwell v. Hobby Lobby* and *Box v. Planned Parenthood of Indiana and Kentucky*.

In the House, FRC Action opposed a number of bills that were anti-religious freedom, and which sought to cement bad policy concerning sexual orientation and gender identity. Most prominent among these was the Equality Act, an anti-life, anti-faith, and anti-freedom bill that would overhaul our federal civil rights framework to mandate special privileges for sexual orientation and gender identity. FRC Action also scored against the reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act because it contained language that would undermine the intended purpose of the original law and because it disregards the privacy and safety of abused women. We supported amendments to the reauthorization that would ensure biological men are not housed with women in emergency shelters and other sex-specific facilities.

Also in the House, FRC Action supported implementation of the Conscience Protection Rule and the Protect Life Rule, supported amendments which would limit or bar funding of abortion overseas, opposed bills that would promote abortion in the military, and opposed bills that would lend legitimacy to the marijuana industry and make it harder to enforce existing marijuana laws.

This vote scorecard contains 22 votes in the House and three votes in the Senate for the First Session of the 116th Congress. While the House may have successfully passed some anti-life, anti-family, and anti-religious liberty pieces of legislation last year, the Senate has declined to bring many of them to the floor. Even with the significant actions taken by President Trump to protect life, family, and religious freedom, much needs to be done legislatively to rebuild a culture where all human life is valued, families flourish, and religious liberty thrives. 116th Congress 1st Session Scorecard Summaries

HOUSE

1. Motion to Recommit Reinstating Mexico City Policy in Consolidated Appropriations Act

Offered by Rep. Kay Granger (R-Texas), the Motion to Recommit sought to include language for the *Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance Policy in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2019* (H.R. 21), which bars taxpayer dollars from funding abortion overseas.

(Failed 01/03/2019, 199 yeas to 232 nays, Roll Call No. 10)

2. Repeal of Mexico City Policy in Consolidated Appropriations Act

Sponsored by Rep. Nita Lowey (D-N.Y.), the *Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2019* (H.R. 21) would repeal the *Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance Policy* instituted by President Trump – a policy which bars taxpayer dollars from funding abortion overseas.

3. For the People Act

Sponsored by Rep. John Sarbanes (D-Md.), the *For the People Act of 2019* (H.R.1) contained several provisions of notable concern affecting free speech and the ability of individuals and non-profit organizations to continue to engage in robust public policy debates.

4. Disapproval of Transgender Military Policy

Sponsored by Rep. Joe Kennedy III (D-Mass.), this resolution (H.Res.124) mischaracterized the new Department of Defense (DOD) policy as a “transgender ban” – which it is not. This resolution also supports the Obama administration’s policy that prioritized social engineering over military readiness and unit cohesion.

5. Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Reauthorization

Sponsored by Rep. Karen Bass (D-Calif.), the *Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019* (H.R. 1585) contains language that undermines the intended purpose of the bill and disregards the privacy and safety of abused women, the largest population of victims. It also allows Planned Parenthood to be a grantee despite a study showing a pattern of refusal to report statutory rape and sexual assault or abuse.

6. Equality Act

Sponsored by Rep. David Cicilline (D-R.I.), the *Equality Act* (H.R. 5) is an anti-life, anti-faith, and anti-freedom bill that would overhaul our federal civil rights framework to mandate special privileges for sexual orientation and gender identity.

(Passed 05/17/19, 236 yeas to 173 nays, Roll Call No. 217)

7. Amendment to Allow Implementation of the Conscience Protection Rule

Offered by Rep. Tom Cole (R-Okla.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 267) to H.R. 2740 the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* would strike language that blocks the Department of Health and Human Services from implementing the *Conscience Protection Rule* that seeks to enforce 25 existing civil rights statutes that protect health care providers from being discriminated against for their religious or moral beliefs.

8. Amendment to Allow Implementation of the Protect Life Rule

Offered by Rep. Martha Roby (R-Ala.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 275) to H.R. 2740 the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* would strike language that blocks the Department of Health and Human Services from implementing the *Protect Life Rule* that draws a clear line between Title X family planning services and abortion.

9. Amendment to Block Restrictions on Fetal Tissue Research

Offered by Rep. Mark Pocan (D-Wis.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 338) to H.R. 2740 the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* would prevent the Department of Health and Human Services from implementing a new policy that restricts taxpayer funding of fetal tissue research conducted by the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

10. Amendment to Limit Funding for Organizations that Promote Abortion Abroad

Offered by Rep. Debbie Lesko (R-Ariz.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 340) to H.R. 2740 the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* would strike language that allows for unlimited funding for domestic non-governmental organizations that provide or promote abortions abroad.

11. Amendment to Prevent Enforcement of Transgender Military Policy

Offered by Rep. Anthony Brown (D-Md.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 362) to H.R. 2740 the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* would prevent the Department of Defense from using appropriated funds to implement the Trump administration's policy regarding open service by those with "gender dysphoria." It thereby seeks to retain the Obama administration's policy that prioritized social engineering over military readiness and unit cohesion.

Passed 06/18/19, 243 yeas to 183 nays, Roll Call No. 344)

12. Labor, Health and Human Services, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2020

Sponsored by Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-Conn.), the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Defense, State, Foreign Operations, and Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act* (H.R. 2740) would repeal the *President's Protect Life Rule, the Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance Policy, Conscience Protection Rule, and Transgender Military Policy.*

(Passed 06/19/19, 226 yeas to 203 nays, Roll Call No. 367)

13. Amendment to Prevent the Department of Justice from Enforcing Marijuana Laws

Offered by Rep. Earl Blumenauer (D-Ore.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 398) to H.R. 3055 the *Commerce, Justice, Science, Agriculture and Rural Development, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act* would restrict the Department of Justice from enforcing the *Controlled Substances Act* in states and territories that have legalized recreational marijuana.

(Passed 06/20/19, 267 yeas to 165 nays, Roll Call No. 370)

14. Amendment to Allow Implementation of HUD Rules Regarding Federal Housing Policy

Offered by Rep. Jeff Duncan (R-S.C.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 469) to the *Commerce, Justice, Science, Agriculture and Rural Development, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act* (H.R. 3055) would strike language that blocks the Department of Transportation, Housing and Urban Development (HUD) from changing an Obama administration rule that allowed biological men to be housed in women's facilities.

(Failed 06/24/19, 180 yeas to 236 nays, Roll Call No. 400)

15. Amendment to Prevent Codification of Obama Transgender Housing Policy

Offered by Rep. Jeff Duncan (R-S.C.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 470) to the *Commerce, Justice, Science, Agriculture and Rural Development, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act* (H.R. 3055) would remove language codifying an Obama-era notice that allowed biological men to be housed with women even in emergency shelters and other facilities.

(Failed 06/24/19, 181 yeas to 236 nays, Roll Call No. 401)

16. Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2020

Sponsored by Rep. Jose Serrano (D-N.Y.), the *Commerce, Justice, Science, Agriculture and Rural Development, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act* (H.R. 3055) would prevent the Department of Justice from enforcing federal laws on recreational marijuana and promote Obama-era sexual orientation and gender identity policies.

(Passed 06/25/19, 227 yeas to 194 nays, Roll Call No. 408)

17. Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act, 2020

Sponsored by Rep. Mike Quigley (D-Ill.), the *Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act* (H.R. 3351) would allow taxpayer funding for elective abortions in D.C. as well as promote the legalization of marijuana and other illicit drugs.

(Passed 06/26/19, 224 yeas to 196 nays, Roll Call No. 424)

18. Amendment to Enforce Gender-Neutral Standards in the Military

Offered by Rep. Jackie Speier (D-Calif.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 509) to the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020* (H.R. 2500) would create gender-neutral standards for entrance into the military, thereby maintaining the Obama administration's policy regarding military service by those with gender dysphoria. It would prevent the implementation of the Trump administration policy that re-prioritized military readiness, lethality, and unit cohesion.

(Passed 07/11/19, 242 yeas to 187 nays, Roll Call No. 439)

19. Amendment to Create a Standardized Family Planning Program for Service Members

Offered by Rep. Jackie Speier (D-Calif.), this amendment (H.Amdt. 510) to the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020* (H.R. 2500) would create a standardized family planning program for service members that could be used to actively promote abortion as a method of family planning and encourage female service members to choose abortion for the purported sake of military readiness.

20. Defense Authorization Bill with New Programs Undermining Family Policy

Sponsored by Rep. Adam Smith (D-Wash.), the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020* (H.R. 2500) would provide fertility services for service members without any protections against the destruction of embryos and create new gender-neutral military standards.

(Passed 07/12/19, 220 yeas to 197 nays, Roll Call No. 473)

21. **SAFE Banking Act**

Sponsored by Rep. Ed Perlmutter (D-Colo.), the *Secure and Fair Enforcement (SAFE) Banking Act of 2020* (HR. 1595) would allow financial institutions to accept federally illegal proceeds from the sale of marijuana, granting the marijuana industry direct access to banking.

22. **Export-Import Bank Affirmative Action for Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity**

Sponsored by Rep. Maxine Waters (D-Calif.), the *United States Export Finance Agency Act of 2019* (H.R. 4863), due to an adopted amendment sponsored by Rep. Harley Rouda (D-Calif.), would create a framework of "affirmative action" for categories including sexual orientation and gender identity. Under these rules, someone who identifies as lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender (LGBT) could be given an unfair advantage (as a bank employee, or as a business owner) over someone who does not identify as LGBT.
