Dear Voter and Friend of the Family,

FRC Action presents our Vote Scorecard for 2021, the First Session of the 117th Congress. This scorecard contains a compilation of significant votes on federal legislation affecting faith, family, and freedom that FRC Action either supported or opposed. These recorded votes span the 2021 calendar year.

In the U.S. Senate, FRC Action scored 25 votes. We scored in favor of protecting born-alive abortion survivors, unborn children diagnosed with Down syndrome, unborn children capable of feeling pain, religious freedom, and women's sports. We also scored in favor of restricting taxpayer funding of abortion and prohibiting research using aborted fetal tissue and human-animal chimeras. Finally, we scored in favor of adding Hyde and Weldon Amendment protections to legislation that lacked them and requiring a report on government restrictions placed on religious exercise during the COVID-19 pandemic.

In addition, we scored against legislation that departed from Hyde Amendment principles and appropriated over \$400 billion that could be used to pay for abortion and health care plans that cover abortion. We scored against redefining "sex" in a way that ignores the biological realities of men and women and against legislation containing a radical social agenda on human sexuality. We scored against legislation that stifled free speech and threatened the freedom of individuals and non-profit organizations to engage in healthy public policy debates. We scored against allowing what would amount to a federal takeover of state elections. Finally, we scored against six votes on Biden administration nominees who were unsuitable for their intended posts.

In the U.S. House of Representatives, FRC Action also scored 25 votes. We scored against two of the most radical bills Congress has ever voted on: the *Equality Act* (which undermines the sanctity of life, the family, and religious liberty) and the *Women's Health Protection Act* (which attempts to codify *Roe v. Wade*). We also scored against co-sponsorships of the *Fairness for All Act*, which is essentially a watered-down *Equality Act*. We scored against legislation that contained abortion funding, promoted abortifacients and Schedule 1 drugs, promoted LGBT ideology, and legitimized recreational marijuana use. Like we did in the Senate, we scored against redefining "sex" in a way that ignores the biological realities of men and women, legislation that threatened the freedom of individuals and non-profit organizations to engage in public policy debates, and legislation that represented an effective federal takeover of state elections.

In addition, we scored against two initiatives that claim to help women but contain progressive elements that would do women harm: the *Violence Against Women Act* reauthorization and the removal of the Equal Rights Amendment ratification deadline. We also scored against a version of the *National Defense Authorization Act* that would have forced women to register for the draft.

Finally, also in the House, we scored in favor of attempts to force a House vote on the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivor Protection Act* and in favor of adding pro-life riders back into legislation from which they were omitted.

A nation's laws both reflect and shape the culture. Standing with believers around this nation, we will continue to work for public policy that is both grounded in and supportive of the truth, enabling us to reestablish a culture in which all human life is valued, families flourish, and religious liberty thrives. 117th Congress 1st Session Scorecard Summaries

HOUSE

1. *Equality Act*

Sponsored by Rep. David Cicilline (D-RI), the *Equality Act* (H.R. 5) would overhaul our federal civil rights framework to mandate special privileges for sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI). It would also expand abortion access and severely erode religious liberty and conscience protections. SOGI should never be enshrined in law as a specially-protected class; doing so is unnecessary and coercive and would have numerous harmful consequences for women, children, medical professionals, people of faith, and even the very members of the LGBT community this bill purports to protect.

(Passed 2/25/2021, 224 yeas to 206 nays, Roll Call No. 39)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

2. *Fairness For All Co-Sponsorship*

Sponsored by Rep. Chris Stewart (R-UT), *Fairness for All* (H.R. 1440) was intended as an alternative to the Equality Act that would protect religious liberty while also elevating sexual orientation and gender identity to a specially-protected class. Unfortunately, because jeopardizing religious liberty was not the only problem with the Equality Act, this bill failed to acknowledge the full scope of the First Amendment or the problems with the Equality Act. Sponsorships for this bill will be open for the full length of the 117th Congress.

(Introduced 2/26/2021, this bill has 21 co-sponsors as of the end of the first session of the 117th Congress. Although the bill could be sponsored at any point in 2021, this score is recorded when the bill was introduced.)

FRC Action opposed co-sponsorship of this Bill.

3. *American Rescue Plan Act*

Sponsored by Rep. John Yarmuth (D-KY), the *American Rescue Plan Act of 2021* (H.R. 1319) was the most substantial deviation from Hyde Amendment principles in decades. This \$1.9 trillion COVID-19 relief package appropriated over \$400 billion that could be used to pay for abortion and health care plans that cover abortion.

(Passed 02/27/2021, 219 yeas to 212 nays, Roll Call No. 49)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

4. *For the People Act*

Sponsored by Rep. John Sarbanes (D-MD), the *For the People Act of 2021* (H.R.1) contained several concerning provisions that would stifle free speech and limit the ability of individuals and non-profit organizations to engage in robust public policy debates.

(Passed 3/3/2021, 220 yeas to 210 nays, Roll Call No. 62)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

5. **Final Passage of the COVID-19 Relief Bill Containing New Abortion Funding**

Amended in the Senate by Schumer Amendment #891, the final text of the \$1.9 trillion COVID-19 relief package contained additional tax subsidies for abortion. The final package included over \$450 billion that could be used to pay for abortion and health care plans that cover abortion.

(Passed 03/10/2021, 220 yeas to 211 nays, Roll Call No. 72)

6. Removing the Deadline for the Ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment

Sponsored by Rep. Jackie Speier (D-CA), this resolution (H.J.Res.17) attempts to remove the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) ratification deadline, which expired approximately 40 years ago. If ratified, the ERA would roll back women's civil rights protections and clear the way for taxpayers to subsidize abortion-on-demand. The U.S. Department of Justice and even high-profile ERA supporters like the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg have said the 1972 ERA is dead, on account of an insufficient number of states ratifying it within 10 years, and that the process to ratify the amendment would need to start over.

7. *Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX), the *Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2021* (H.R. 1620) undermines its stated purpose of protecting and helping victimized women. This reauthorization harms the very women it ought to be protecting by disregarding their privacy and safety. Also, it would allow Planned Parenthood to be a grantee despite a documented pattern of failing to report statutory rape, sexual assault, and abuse.

8. *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act Discharge Petition*

Filed by Rep. Kat Cammack (R-FL), this discharge petition would force a floor vote on the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act* (H.R. 619) if it gathered 218 signatures. This petition was filed because of House leadership's failure to consider Born-Alive, an important measure that would require health care practitioners to provide the same medical care to infants born alive after a failed abortion that they would to any other infant born at the same gestational age.

(Filed on 4/14/2021, this petition garnered 213 of the required 218 signatures as of the end of the first session of the 117th Congress. Although the petition could be signed at any point in 2021, this score is recorded when the petition was filed.)

9. *Paycheck Fairness Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-CT), the *Paycheck Fairness Act* (H.R. 7) undermined its goal of creating fair wages for women by redefining "sex" in a way that ignores the biological realities of men and women. It would also create additional mandates on employers to cover gender transition procedures and abortion in health care plans.

(Passed 04/15/21, 217 yeas to 210 nays, Roll Call No. 108)

10. *Secure and Fair Enforcement (SAFE) Banking Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Ed Perlmutter (D-CO), the *Secure and Fair Enforcement (SAFE) Banking Act of 2021* (H.R. 1996) would allow financial institutions to accept federally-illegal proceeds from the sale of marijuana, granting the marijuana industry direct access to banking.

(Passed 04/19/21, 321 yeas to 101 nays, Roll Call No. 120)

11. *Washington, D.C. Admission Act*

Sponsored by Del. Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-DC), the *Washington, D.C. Admission Act* (H.R. 51) would admit Washington, D.C. as the 51st state. This measure is unconstitutional and does not reflect our Founders' intention for the federal seat of government to be independent of any one state in the Union. Proponents of D.C.'s admission as a state ignore the constitutional and practical problems this would create, making clear that this is primarily a political move to try to secure a Democratic advantage in the Senate.

12. *Vote to Bring Up No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act*

This ordering of the Previous Question (PQ) vote sought to establish the rules for debate and consideration of several bills. The effect of a "Nay" vote on the rule would have been to provide for the immediate consideration of the *No Taxpayer Funding of Abortion Act* (H.R.18), sponsored by Rep. Chris Smith (R-NJ). This vote was a procedural mechanism to get all members of Congress on the record regarding codifying the Hyde Amendment, which prohibits taxpayer funding for elective abortion.

13. *LGBTQ Business Equal Credit Enforcement and Investment Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Ritchie Torres (D-NY), the *LGBTQ Business Equal Credit Enforcement and Investment Act* (H.R. 1443) would have redefined "sex" in a way that ignores the biological realities of men and women, under the guise of selectively collecting data on small business loans. This redefinition would be especially detrimental to women entrepreneurs.

(Passed 06/24/21, 252 yeas to 176 nays, Roll Call No. 182)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

14. *Equal Access to Contraception for Veterans Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Julia Brownley (D-CA), the *Equal Access to Contraception for Veterans Act* (H.R. 239) would increase insurance coverage to 100 percent (including co-pay) for all FDA-approved forms of contraception for veterans. This would expand taxpayer funding of FDA-approved contraception, including emergency contraception like Plan B and ella, which can act as abortifacients by preventing the implantation of an embryonic human being.

(Passed 06/24/21, 245 yeas to 181 nays, Roll Call No. 184)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

15. *Amendment to Allow Government Promotion of Illicit Drugs*

Offered by Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-NY), H.Amdt. 85 to H.R. 4502 would have stricken an existing policy rider that prohibits federal funds from being used to promote the legalization of Schedule I drugs. Removing this language would have allowed the federal government to use taxpayer money for the purpose of promoting drugs like heroin that do not have widely-accepted medical use and have a high potential for abuse.

16. State Department Appropriations Bill Removing Existing Pro-Life Policies

Sponsored by Rep. Barbara Lee (D-CA), the *State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 2022* (H.R. 4373) would reverse over 47 years of bipartisan policies prohibiting the subsidization of abortions abroad with American tax dollars. Specifically, this bill would allow taxpayer funding for abortions, abortion businesses, and organizations like the United Nations Population Fund that are complicit in underwriting coercive abortion practices in China.

(Passed 07/28/21, 217 yeas to 212 nays, Roll Call No. 243)

FRC Action opposed this Bill.

17. Motion to Recommit Re-Adding Long-Standing Pro-Life Amendments

Offered by Rep. Tom Cole (R-OK), this Motion to Recommit on H.R. 4502 sought to add back in the language of several long-standing pro-life riders that the House Appropriations Committee had removed. These amendments included the Hyde, Weldon, Dornan, and Smith amendments. Collectively, they would have prohibited taxpayer funding for abortion and protected the conscience rights of medical professionals who object to performing abortions.

18. Appropriations Bill Removing the Hyde Amendment

Sponsored by Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-CT), the *Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Agriculture, Rural Development, Energy and Water Development, Financial Services and General Government, Interior, Environment, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act, 2022* (H.R. 4502) is a seven-bill spending package that would repeal several long-standing pro-life policies. For the first time since 1976, this appropriations bill did not include the Hyde Amendment, which has prohibited federal taxpayer funding of abortion for over 40 years.

19. John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act

Sponsored by Rep. Terri Sewell (D-AL), the *John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021* (H.R. 4) is an overzealous attempt by the federal government to gain control over state election laws. It would set a dangerous precedent that could lead to other state laws—like pro-life protections—needing “preclearance” from political appointees at the U.S. Department of Justice before enactment.

(Passed 08/24/21, 219 yeas to 212 nays, Roll Call No. 260)

20. National Defense Authorization Act

Sponsored by Rep. Adam Smith (D-WA), the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022* (H.R. 4350) would require women to register for the Selective Service, subjecting them to the draft. This year’s NDAA contains several other anti-life and anti-family provisions.

(Passed 9/23/21, 316 yeas to 113 nays, Roll Call No. 293)

21. Motion to Recommit Adding the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act*

Offered by Rep. Julia Letlow (R-LA), the Motion to Recommit sought to include the entire language of the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act* (H.R. 619) as an amendment to the *Women's Health Protection Act* (H.R. 3755). This language would have required health care practitioners to provide the same medical care to infants born alive after a failed abortion that they would to any other infant born at the same gestational age. It would have also created criminal penalties to enforce what is currently only a definitional provision in federal law.

(Failed 09/24/2021, 210 yeas to 219 nays, Roll Call No. 294)

22. *Women's Health Protection Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA), the *Women's Health Protection Act* (H.R. 3755) would mandate abortion-on-demand nationwide while simultaneously striking down commonsense pro-life laws across the United States. This is the most radical abortion bill to have ever been voted on in the U.S Congress.

23. *Family Violence Prevention and Services Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Lucy McBath (D-GA), the *Family Violence Prevention and Services Act* (H.R. 2119) does not live up to its purpose of supporting emergency shelters and support services for victims of domestic violence. This reauthorization included language that could open up funding to abortion and mandates gender identity ideology, both of which are harmful to the women, children, and families this bill was intended to protect.

(Passed on 10/26/2021, 228 yeas to 200 nays, Roll Call No. 336)

24. Bipartisan Infrastructure Package Containing Radical Sexual Ideology

The Senate amendment to the *INVEST in America Act* (H.R. 3684) was couched as a bipartisan infrastructure package to improve ports, roads, and bridges. However, it included poison pill language to advance a radical agenda on marriage and sexuality. Section 60307 of Title III, the *Digital Equity Act of 2021*, includes a nondiscrimination clause that enshrines sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) to a specially-protected class status. SOGI should never be so enshrined; doing so is unnecessary, coercive, and has numerous tangential harmful consequences.

25. *Build Back Better Act*

Sponsored by Rep. John Yarmuth (D-KY), the *Build Back Better Act* (H.R. 5376) is nothing more than a progressive wish list that superimposes the government into the role of caretaker. Disguised as a bill to help families flourish, this bill would instead increase marriage penalties and weaken the institution of

marriage, fund the killing of unborn children through abortion, and replace faith-based early education centers with a one-size-fits-all program that can begin teaching things like gender identity ideology to children as early as age three.

(Passed 11/19/2021, 220 yeas to 213 nays, Roll Call No. 385)

SOGI should never be enshrined as a specially-protected class in law; doing so is unnecessary, coercive, and has numerous harmful consequences. The vote was on the Motion to Proceed to the underlying bill, which required 60 votes.
