Dear Voter and Friend of the Family,

FRC Action presents our Vote Scorecard for 2024, the Second Session of the 118th Congress. This scorecard contains a compilation of significant votes on federal legislation affecting faith, family, and freedom that FRC Action either supported or opposed, as well as one cosponsorship that FRC Action opposed. These recorded votes span the 2024 calendar year.

In the U.S. Senate, FRC Action scored four votes. We scored against a bill that claimed to establish a statutory right to contraception but would actually expand abortion and curtail religious liberty. We scored against a bill that sought to establish a statutory right to “fertility treatments” broadly defined but would open the door to legalizing various forms of human embryo experimentation, disregarding the human dignity of unborn children. Additionally, we scored against a bill that would formally approve of *Roe v. Wade*—a decision the U.S. Supreme Court has since ruled was “egregiously wrong from the start”—and statutorily establish the right to kill an unborn child throughout pregnancy.

In the U.S. House of Representatives, FRC Action scored 12 votes. We scored in favor of two pro-life bills: one that would prohibit the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services from restricting the use of certain government funding for pregnancy resource centers and one that would require colleges and universities to inform female students about their rights and protections to carry their pregnancies to term. Additionally, we scored against cosponsorship of a resolution that expressed support for assisted reproductive technology procedures without addressing the pro-life concerns endemic to how these procedures are currently practiced in the United States.

We scored in favor of a resolution disapproving of the Biden administration’s Title IX rule that threatens the safety and privacy of women and girls by allowing males into female-only spaces and to participate in sports intended for females. We also scored in favor of a bill that would require any pandemic-related agreement reached by the World Health Organization to be considered a treaty requiring the advice and consent of the Senate.


Additionally, we scored against one amendment to a House appropriations bill that would remove protections for veterans from so-called “medical” marijuana state programs. We also scored in favor of six amendments to the annual *National Defense Authorization Act*. These included three amendments to curb the influence of gender ideology in the military, one to prohibit the secretary of defense from funding abortion, one to prohibit funding for companies engaged in censorship, and one to eliminate the chief diversity officer position at the U.S. Department of Defense.

A nation’s laws both reflect and shape the culture. FRC Action is committed to ensuring that a biblical worldview has a voice on Capitol Hill and to working for public policies that foster a culture in which all human life is valued, families flourish, and religious liberty thrives.

1. *Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Michelle Fischbach (R-MN), the *Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act* (H.R. 6918) would prohibit the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) from finalizing, implementing, or enforcing a current rule or any similar rulemaking that would restrict the use of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funding for pregnancy resource centers. This bill was especially timely, as HHS had recently proposed a rule that could restrict TANF funds from going to these vital centers that help women, children, and families in need.



(Passed on 1/18/2024, 214 yeas to 208 nays, Roll Call No. 17)
FRC Action supported this Bill.

2. *Pregnant Students' Rights Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Ashley Hinson (R-IA), the *Pregnant Students' Rights Act* (H.R. 6914) would amend the *Higher Education Act* to require colleges and universities to inform female students about their rights and protections to carry their pregnancies to term. Under the bill, these women would be informed of available resources and accommodations, such as the opportunity to be granted modified class schedules and excused absences and programs on campus and organizations in the local community offering support to young mothers.



(Passed on 1/18/2024, 212 yeas to 207 nays, Roll Call No. 19)
FRC Action supported this Bill.

3. *Assisted Reproductive Technology Resolution Cosponsorship*

Sponsored by Rep. Nancy Mace (R-SC), H.Res. 1043 expresses support for assisted reproductive technology (ART) procedures without regard for pro-life problems endemic to how ART, including in vitro fertilization (IVF), is practiced in the United States. The resolution condemns a ruling by the Alabama Supreme Court that favored parents whose embryos were destroyed due to insufficient security at an IVF clinic and calls on Congress to protect unrestricted access to ART procedures. This resolution is inaccurate and mischaracterizes the Alabama decision, which did not threaten access to IVF but rather stated that the state's *Wrongful Death of a Minor Act* applied to all embryos regardless of their location. This resolution plays into unfounded fears regarding the Alabama ruling and concerningly calls for unrestricted access to procedures that result in the routine and purposeful destruction of living human embryos and the exploitation of parents struggling with infertility.

FRC Action opposed cosponsorship of this Resolution.

4. **Amendment to Remove Protections for Veterans from So-Called “Medical” Marijuana State Programs**

Sponsored by Reps. Brian Mast (R-FL), Earl Blumenauer (D-OR), Barbara Lee (D-CA), Dave Joyce (R-OH), and Jasmine Crockett (D-TX), Amendment #28 to H.R. 8580, the *Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2025*, would remove protections for veterans from so-called “medical” marijuana state programs by rescinding a directive that prevents Veterans Affairs medical facility staff from recommending, making referrals, or completing forms and registering veterans for participation. Although the intent behind this amendment was laudable, marijuana has many known harms, such as decreased blood flow, problems with learning and memory, and symptoms similar to schizophrenia, and it may even contribute to Alzheimer’s disease. Our veterans deserve better, and taxpayers should not underwrite programs subjecting them to these harms.



(Passed on 6/4/2024, 290 yeas to 116 nays, Roll Call No. 240)
FRC Action opposed this Amendment.

5. **Amendment to Prohibit Insurance Coverage for “Gender Transition” Procedures for Military Service Members**

Sponsored by Rep. Matt Rosendale (R-MT), Amendment #52 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would prohibit the provision of “gender transition” procedures, including surgery and pharmaceuticals, through TRICARE (health insurance for military service members) at the U.S. Department of Defense. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 213 yeas to 206 nays, Roll Call No. 262)
FRC Action supported this Amendment.

6. **Amendment to Prohibit the U.S. Secretary of Defense from Paying for Abortions**

Sponsored by Rep. Beth Van Duyne (R-TX), Amendment #55 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would prohibit the U.S. secretary of defense from paying for or reimbursing expenses related to abortion services. This amendment pushes back against the Biden administration’s unlawful promotion of abortion within the military. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 214 yeas to 207 nays, Roll Call No. 263)
FRC Action supported this Amendment.

7. Amendment to Eliminate the Position of Chief Diversity Officer of the U.S. Department of Defense

Sponsored by Reps. Clay Higgins (R-LA), Chip Roy (R-TX), and Jeff Duncan (R-SC), Amendment #43 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would eliminate the position of chief diversity officer within the U.S. Department of Defense and prohibit the establishment of any substantially similar position. The U.S. military should be focused on enhancing military readiness, lethality, and unit cohesion, not on social engineering. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 214 yeas to 210 nays, Roll Call No. 268)
FRC Action supported this Amendment.

8. Amendment to Prohibit Government Funding of Companies Engaged in Suppressing Lawful Speech

Sponsored by Rep. Roger Williams (R-TX), Amendment #45 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would prohibit funding of companies that demonetize or rate the credibility of a domestic entity (including news and information outlets) based on lawful speech under the guise of “fact-checking” so-called misinformation, disinformation, or malinformation. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 218 yeas to 206 nays, Roll Call No. 270)
FRC Action supported this Amendment.

9. Amendment to Prohibit the U.S. Department of Defense Education Activity from Using Material that Promotes Radical Gender Ideology or Pornographic Content

Sponsored by Rep. Greg Steube (R-FL), Amendment #46 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would prohibit the U.S. Department of Defense Education Activity from purchasing, displaying, or maintaining material that promotes radical gender ideology or pornographic content. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 221 yeas to 202 nays, Roll Call No. 271)
FRC Action supported this Amendment.

10. Amendment to Prohibit the Provision of “Gender Transition” Procedures Through the Exceptional Family Medical Program

Sponsored by Rep. Ralph Norman (R-SC), Amendment #53 to H.R. 8070, the *Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025*, would prohibit the provision of “gender transition” procedures, including surgery or pharmaceuticals, through the Exceptional Family Medical Program. The underlying bill, H.R. 8070, sets priorities and authorizes funding levels for the U.S. military for the 2025 fiscal year. An authorization bill for national defense is passed by Congress annually.



(Passed on 6/13/2024, 218 yeas to 205 nays, Roll Call No. 275)

FRC Action supported this Amendment.

11. Resolution Disapproving of the Biden Administration’s Title IX Rule Allowing Males to Participate in Sports Intended for Females

Sponsored by Rep. Mary Miller (R-IL), H.J. Res. 165 provides for congressional disapproval of the Biden administration’s final rule entitled “Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance.” This rule threatens the safety and privacy of women and girls by allowing biological males into female-only spaces such as locker rooms and bathrooms and allowing males to participate in sports intended for females. If passed into law, H.J. Res. 165 would stop this harmful rule, protect the privacy and safety of women and girls, and continue to ensure equal opportunity in athletics and education.



(Passed on 7/11/2024, 210 yeas to 205 nays, Roll Call No. 354)

FRC Action supported this Resolution.

12. *No WHO Pandemic Preparedness Treaty Without Senate Approval Act*

Sponsored by Rep. Tom Tiffany (R-WI), H.R. 1425, the *No WHO Pandemic Preparedness Treaty Without Senate Approval Act*, would require that any pandemic-related convention or agreement reached by the World Health Organization (WHO) be considered a treaty requiring the advice and consent of the U.S. Senate. This would prevent the executive branch from charging ahead with a WHO Pandemic Preparedness Agreement without considering the will of the American people through their elected representatives. This agreement stands to seriously threaten American national sovereignty and free speech and would surrender public health policy to the WHO—an unelected, unaccountable international organization that proved inept at dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. H.R. 1425 would guard our national sovereignty and ensure that the voices of the American people are heard.



(Passed on 9/11/2024, 219 yeas to 199 nays, Roll Call No. 411)

FRC Action supported this Bill.

1. Cloture on the *Right to Contraception Act*

Sponsored by Sen. Ed Markey (D-MA), the so-called *Right to Contraception Act* (S. 4381) purports to establish a statutory right to contraception. In reality, this bill would expand abortion and curtail religious liberty. Its vague language could be used to overturn commonsense conscience and parental consent laws and guarantee a right to contraceptives that can act as abortifacients, the abortion drug mifepristone, and possibly even gender transition procedures. Additionally, the bill explicitly exempts itself from the *Religious Freedom Restoration Act*, thereby favoring substantial governmental burdens on religious healthcare providers and employers who may object to providing certain drugs and services on conscience grounds. This cloture vote was on the Motion to Proceed to the underlying bill, which required 60 votes.



(Failed on 6/5/2024, 51 yeas to 39 nays, Roll Call No. 190)
FRC Action opposed this Motion.

2. Cloture on the *Right to IVF Act*

Sponsored by Sen. Tammy Duckworth (D-IL), the so-called *Right to IVF Act* (S. 4445) purports to establish a statutory right to “fertility treatments,” including artificial reproductive technology (ART), broadly defined. In reality, this four-bill package could lead to the legalization of practices such as human cloning, gene-editing, the creation of three-parent embryos, the creation of human-animal chimeras, and other forms of human embryo experimentation. This bill package would fund ART procedures for service members and veterans (including same-sex and unmarried couples) with taxpayer dollars and mandate insurance coverage of ART procedures nationwide. It could also place new mandates on religious and pro-life organizations that compel them to violate their sincerely held beliefs. S. 4445 would also make it nearly impossible for states to enforce commonsense laws regulating ART and the billion-dollar IVF industry to protect the rights of parents and the human dignity of unborn children. This cloture vote was on the Motion to Proceed to the underlying bill, which required 60 votes. Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) changed his vote to “nay” so that the bill could be brought back to the floor for a vote later.



(Failed on 6/13/2024, 48 yeas to 47 nays, Roll Call No. 197)
FRC Action opposed this Motion.

3. Cloture on the *Reproductive Freedom for Women Act*

Sponsored by Sen. Patty Murray (D-WA), the so-called *Reproductive Freedom for Women Act* (S. 4554) expresses the sense of Congress that “access to abortion rights” should be supported following the U.S. Supreme Court’s decision to overturn *Roe v. Wade* in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization* and that the “right” to abortion established by *Roe* should not only be codified into law but “built upon.” This bill would enshrine Congress’ approval of a U.S. Supreme Court decision that the Court has since ruled was “egregiously wrong from the start” and statutorily establish the right to kill an unborn child throughout pregnancy. This cloture vote was on the Motion to Proceed to the underlying bill, which required 60 votes.



(Failed on 7/10/2024, 49 yeas to 44 nays, Roll Call No. 211)
FRC Action opposed this Bill.

4. **Second Cloture Vote on the *Right to IVF Act***

Sponsored by Sen.
